DNR dredging permit was submitted. Next steps are to work with the Village on an agreement for the route and disposal on the park land. Provide a Temporary Limited Easement (TLE) with land owners with dewatering sites. For both of these we will need legal review. JJ will contact an attorney for cost estimate to review both the Village agreement and TLE.

Board discussed releasing more funds to cover setup costs. Nate Rice suggested waiting until the next meeting with an item within the agenda.

The Board discussed the timing of the next steps and decided to reconvene early November to make further decisions.

Dan McCormack asked Todd Weik to provide estimates on the dredging in order to analyze the financials for the next meeting.

b) Update Aquatic Invasive Plants – JJ Alaily – Treatment and Prevention – JJ received recommendations to resurvey the lake aquatic plants to see if the treatment areas have changed at the cost of \$3,500. He has not received the survey results yet.

The District was approached with information on a Federally Funded system to combat starry stonewort along with Waukesha County and Lower Nemahbin Association. Nate will report back with more information.
